The Darkness

CHILDREN IN CRISIS

44 million children in India are vulnerable to abuse, exploitation and enslavement.



25.7M

There are 25.7 million orphans in India, the most in the world.

1.2M

There are 1.2 million child prostitutes in India.

In India 47% of young children are malnourished and girls are impacted more than boys.

This crisis is overwhelming, but it's even worse for girls.

Even before they're born there's a battle being waged against women. Girls in India face abortion, infanticide, neglect and rape.

BORN INTO DANGER

The crisis for children is the worst in the dangerous slums and red-light districts. The slums are home to 64 million people in India. But it gets even darker in the red-light district where trafficking of minors is a \$1 billion industry in Mumbai alone.

Whether born in the slums or the red-light district, these girls face a lifetime of danger.

A GIRL IN THE HIGH-RISK SLUMS IS:

BORN A BURDEN

A daughter means pressure for parents to arrange a marriage and come up with a dowry. One woman dies every hour in dowry related deaths in India.



DOOMED TO LIFELONG POVERTY

Children in extreme poverty are often forced to skip school in order to help provide a living for the family. This results in generational cycles of poverty and abuse.



PLAGUED BY EXTREME MALNUTRITION

Up to one-third of the world's under-nourished children are Indian. Girls are more affected than boys.

LIKELY TO FACE RAPE

Sexual violence is pervasive in India, with a rape reported every 22 minutes.

POWERLESS TO KEEP HER CHILDREN FROM EXTREME POVERTY

A girl who grows up in poverty has her own children and never finds a way out. The cycle of poverty can be endless.



HEADED FOR EARLY MARRIAGE AND LIFELONG MARITAL ABUSE

Almost half (47%) of the girls in India get married before 18, often resulting in a lifetime of marital abuse.



A GIRL IN THE RED-LIGHT DISTRICT IS:

BORN A COMMODITY

Brothel owners see a baby as a future sex slave, a source of profit rather than a person. The trafficking of children in Mumbai alone is a billion dollar industry.

FORCED INTO SLAVERY BY HER 8TH BIRTHDAY

Girls are pushed into prostitution earlier every year. She'll be enslaved as early as 7 years old.



PRONE TO SEVERE SICKNESS

Sexually transmitted diseases are treated poorly or left untreated, wreaking havoc on the girls' physical health. 60% of girls in Mumbai's red-light district have HIV.



LIKELY TO HAVE 6 TO 7 ABORTIONS PER YEAR

Brothel owners don't bother with birth control and pregnancy is common. Since pregnancy is bad for business, forced abortions are the norm.



POWERLESS TO KEEP HER CHILDREN FROM SLAVERY

95% of girls born in the red-light district become enslaved.

HEADED FOR AN EARLY DEATH

Life expectancy in Mumbai's red-light district is 35 years of age.



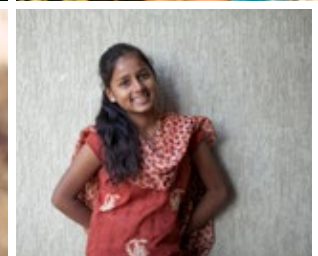
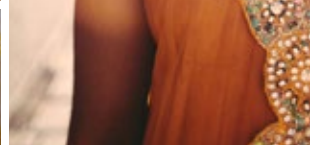
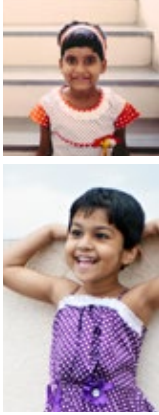

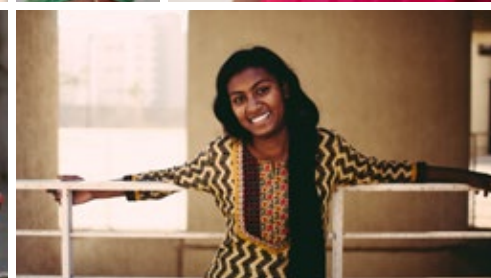
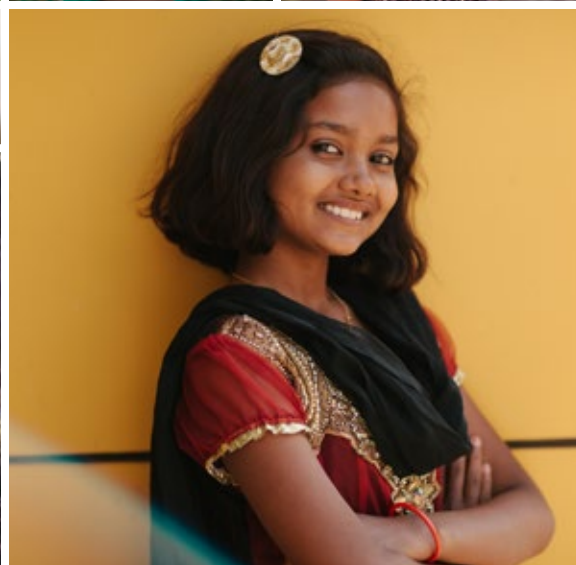
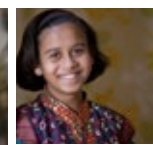
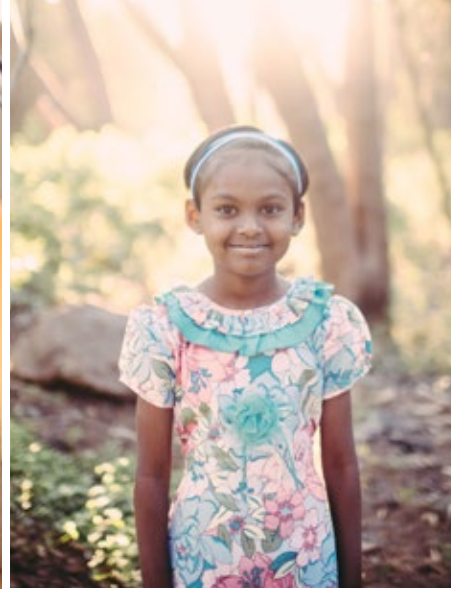
What do we do in the face of such darkness?

We Are As Our Own



We are a Christ-based, community driven movement in India that rescues and protects children from slavery and exploitation and cares for them as our own for life.

Our work is done through...

PREVENTION

We prevent the spread of darkness in the community.

RESCUE

We rescue girls from danger, death and despair, and into a family.

AFTERCARE

We care for each girl as our own, for life.

Prevention

Abuse, exploitation and slavery cause lifelong harm. The best way to defeat these horrors is to stop them before they can start. That means prevention.

PREVENTION STARTS WITH BEING PRESENT

The crisis for children in India is darkest in the slums and red-light districts. These communities are ill equipped to halt the cycles of neglect, exploitation, abuse and enslavement.

So we have a presence in these communities, empowering people and bringing hope. We have a network of 19 Lighthouse Centers working in 97 different communities, as well as our leadership development program through Hope College.

We support these communities and families as our own, before trouble sets in.

LIGHTHOUSE CENTERS

Much of our prevention work in these communities happens through our Lighthouse Centers. These are churches making a difference on the ground. They offer spiritual support, physical care, education, community development, health care and more.

HOPE COLLEGE

At Hope College we develop strong local leaders, rooted in biblical truth. We train them to be community leaders in these tough places and to reach the vulnerable children in crisis.

CHANGING SOCIETY

By building up these local communities we can tackle the root of the problem. We can strengthen and support families, marriages and children long before they come to a breaking point. Our investment in leaders who invest in their community produces more leaders who can help their community—and that fosters new societal patterns free of exploitation and enslavement.



The leadership conferences we hold several times per year give local community leaders a chance to grow.



Rescue

No matter how much prevention work we do, rescue is still needed. And that rescue can happen because we're present in the midst of the darkness. We have a presence established in the red-light districts and slums through our community relationships and Lighthouse Centers. When people are in trouble they come to us because they know we can help.

EARLY RESCUE

We have to help before it's too late. If we don't intervene, these girls will be scarred for life. So we act as early as we can to protect and rescue girls who are on the very verge of enslavement.

95%

RESCUED IN THE HIGH-RISK SLUMS

Through our Lighthouse Centers in the slums, we identify girls in danger of being enslaved and abused, and we step in to rescue them before they are exploited.

- >> A father was in the process of selling his 9- and 12-year-old daughters into the sex trade when their mother came to us, desperate to protect her girls.
- >> A father's trip to the red-light district brought AIDS into the home, killing both parents and orphaning the child. Thankfully we rescued her before predators could get to her.
- >> A baby girl was thrown in the garbage dump because she was a girl. Her grandparents rescued her, but couldn't care for her and came to a Lighthouse Center for help.





Rescued from the Red-Light District

Sajala's mom is a sex slave. But there's no childcare in the sex trade. So 3-year-old Sajala slept on the floor under the bed while her mom worked.

That's the harsh reality in the red-light district. Even worse, it's almost certain that Sajala would follow in her mother's footsteps.

When we discovered this desperate situation, we swung into action, worked hard to rescue Sajala and welcomed her into our family!

Today she's thriving. She's at the top of her class in school. It's a life she would never have known if she stayed in the brothel.

Aftercare

Each rescued girl becomes a daughter in our family. They are sisters to each other. Our house moms and dads become their parents and our other staff members are like aunts and uncles. They become family for life.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

The As Our Own approach changes everything. Seeing these girls as our daughters instead of orphans is at the core of who we are. From staffing to education, we want the best for our girls. It also changes how the girls see themselves. They're confident, optimistic and full of joy.

Education today unlocks possibilities for our daughters tomorrow. Education is one of the most critical tools in redefining their futures. So we're there to help them with tutors, study times and homework.

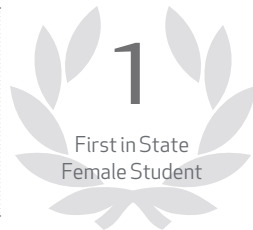

TOTAL REVENUE BY YEAR

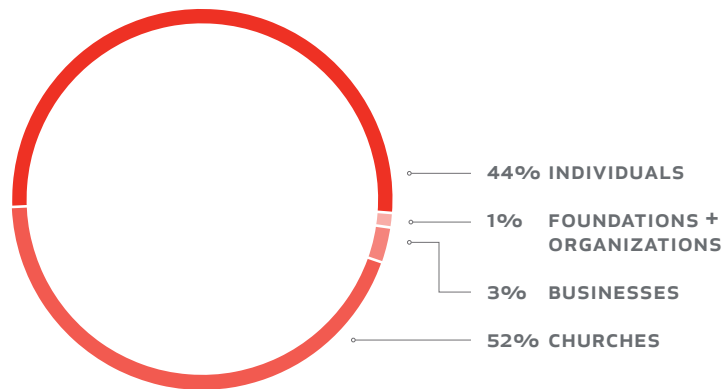

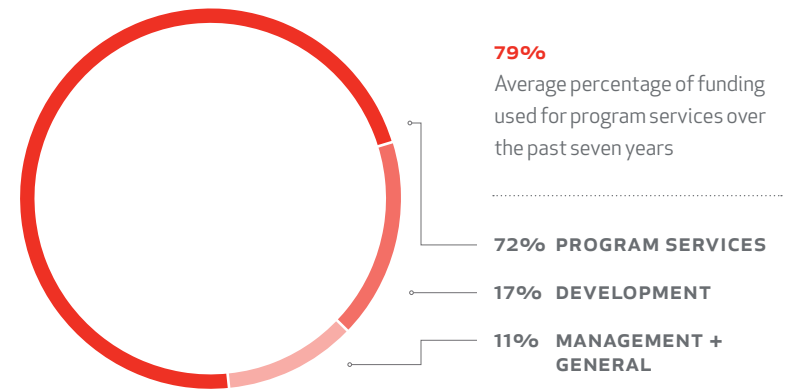

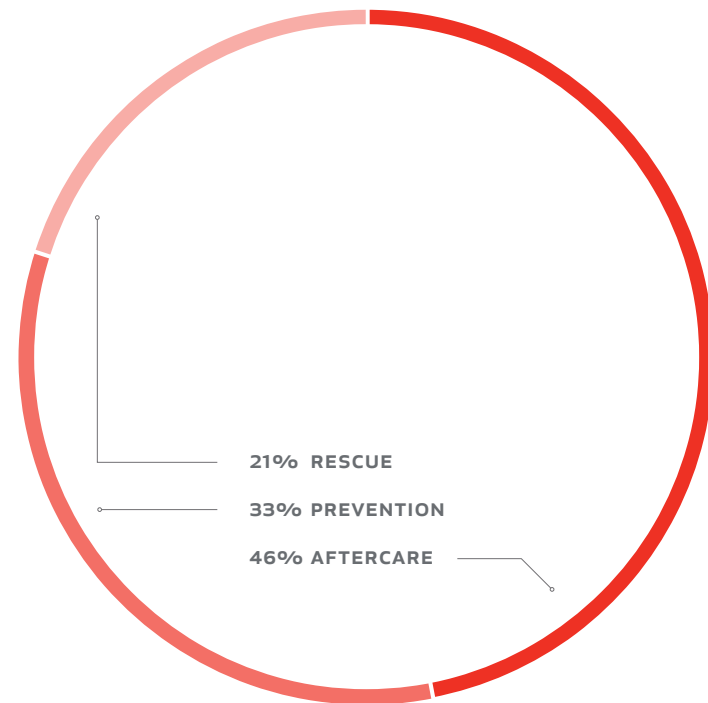
